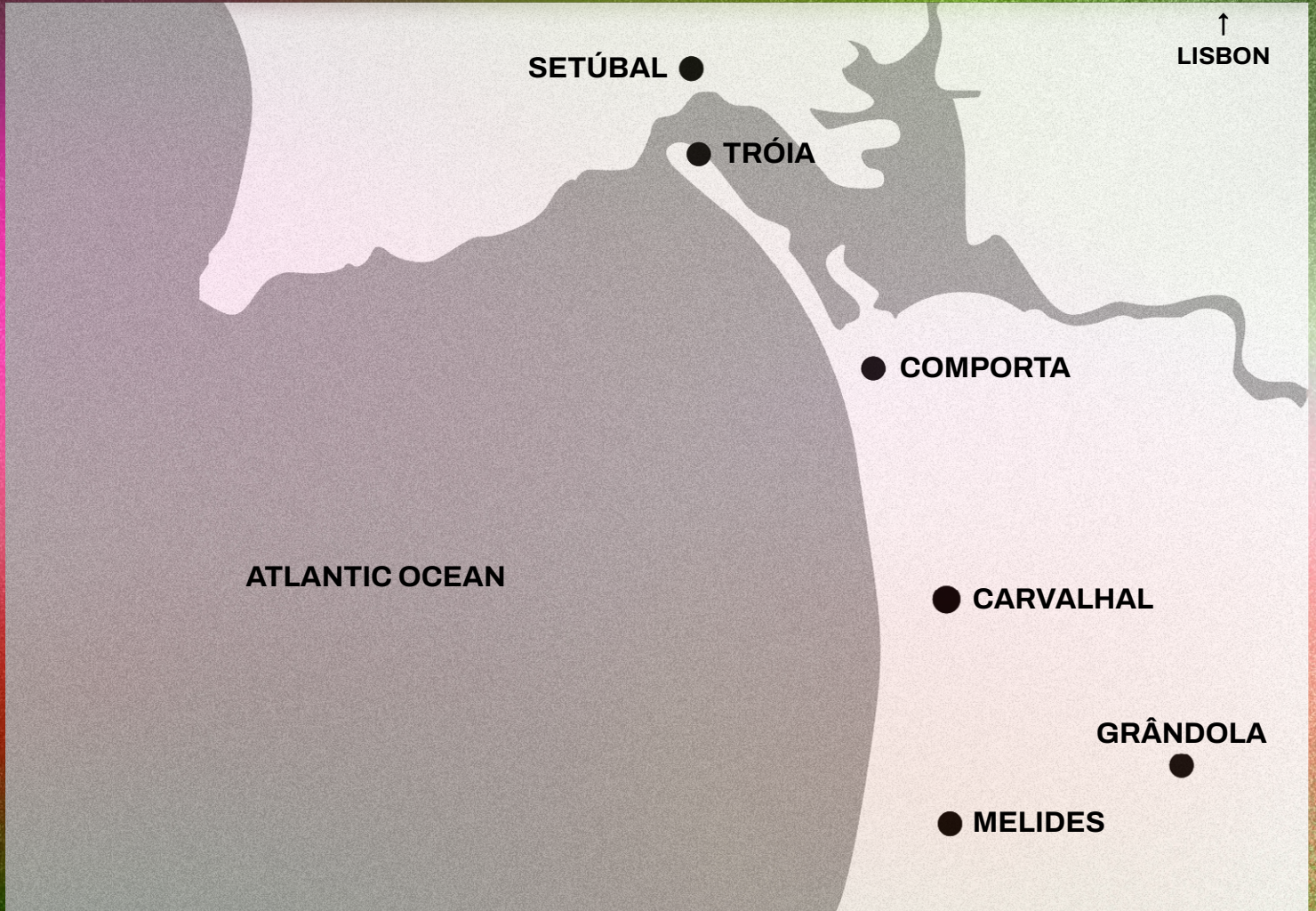

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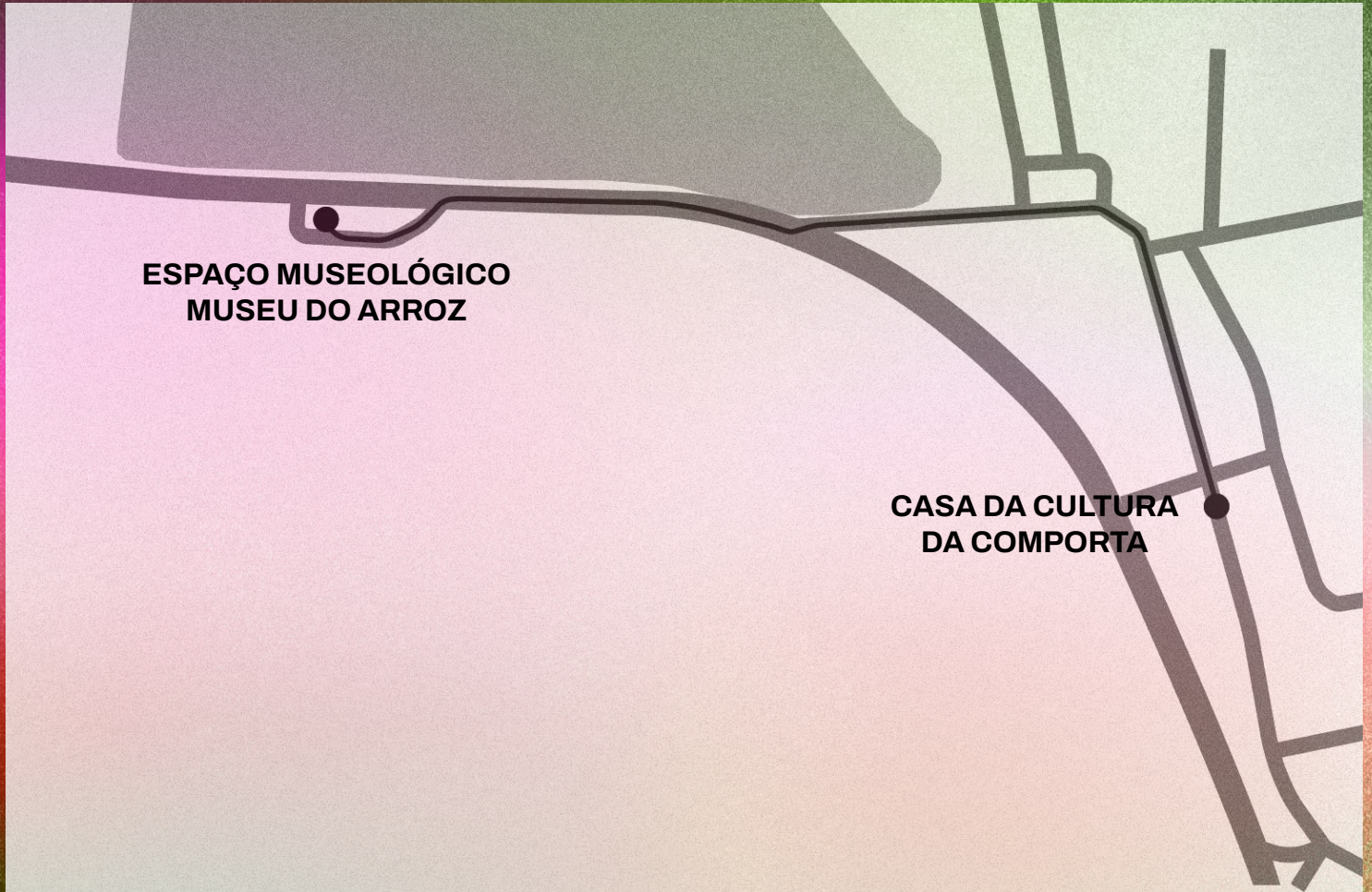


Comporta is a village on the west coast of Portugal, about an hour's drive from Lisbon. But when people talk about Comporta, what they really mean is the region around it. The Herdade da Comporta is a swoop of coast between the Sado Estuary and the sea, 12,500 hectares comprising seven hamlets: Pego, Carvalhal, Brejos, Torre, Possanco, Carrasqueira and Comporta, too.

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HOW TO GO FROM MUSEU DO ARROZ TO CASA DA CULTURA ?

The distance between Espaço Museológico Museu do Arroz and Casa da Cultura da Comporta is 550 meters, about an 8-minute walk.

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USEFUL TIPS

A car to get around between the villages and beaches is essential.

Comporta is not a party town with never ending options of beach clubs and nightlife, it is all about beach and nature.

People meet at each other's homes and naturally small gatherings happen.

Mosquitos come out to play at sunset so make sure to take plenty of repellent.

Book lunch, book dinner, book drinks... it gets busy in the summer so make sure to make reservations in advance.

Beaches - there is Pego and Carvalhal where there are restaurants, shades, surf classes and lots of fun.

For a quiet dip on an almost desert beach walk or hop on a bike through the rice fields and over the dune - it's worth it!

Take a day to explore the surrounding areas, visit the village of Melides and lunch at Praia da Aberta a Nova.

HOW TO GET THERE?

Comporta is on the Atlantic coast south of Setúbal, 125 km from Lisbon, Portugal's capital. When arriving in Lisbon there are two ways to get to Comporta, both routes take approximately 1h20. The closest airport is Lisbon's.

CAR

The first way to get to Comporta from Lisbon is by highway. The trip takes about 1h15m and you must take the A2 or A12, going until the exit in Alcácer do Sal or Grândola. Both are cities in the Alentejo region.

FERRY FROM SETÚBAL

From Lisbon to Setúbal is approximately 40 minutes by car. To get to Setúbal, you will need to follow the direction of the A2 or the A12 freeway. This is either over the 25 de abril bridge or the Vasco da Gama bridge. To Comporta, you will need to take the ferry from Setúbal to Troia.

• Where to catch the ferry?

Atlantic ferries: Avenida Jaime Rebelo (Doca do Comércio), Setúbal

• Departure times?

In the summer every 30 minutes.

• Crossing time?

Approx. 25 minutes.
