Attracted by the power of image and, in particular, by sensations that stem from the sense of vision, Luiz Roque's work crosses different territories, such as the genre of science fiction, the legacy of Modernism, pop-culture and queer bio-politics, in order to understand the propose ingenious and visually sensual narratives. The plasticity of the allegories he uses in his films takes us through the current conflict between technological advancement and contemporary micro and macro power relations.

Roque's works inhabit a space between cinema, art and critical theory; all within the scope of political dispute that is both real and imaginary. Furthermore, his works comment on the dissociative conditions of being: between the latency of life and respective bureaucratic definitions. In this sense, his works combine the splendour of science fiction - as a device for the dissemination of hypotheses - with resources from the language of cinema in order to present us with scenarios of social tension and complex public debates.

Luiz Roque (b. 1979, Cachoeira do Sul, Brazil) lives and works in São Paulo.

Estufa is the first mid-career survey of the artist Luiz Roque (b. 1979, BR). Roque's practice inhabits a space between expanded cinema, visual art, and critical theory. His artistic methodology fuses an interest in the legacies of modernism, pop culture, queer (bio-)politics, and science fiction. This anachronistic approach culminates in timeless montages and environments while often disclosing the urgency of pressing socio-political issues of specific communities and subcultures. His open-ended, short videos are speculative, leaving the viewer wondering about the array of possibilities within alternative realities. The past, present, and future coalesce in each video, resulting in captivating trans-temporal amalgams.

Roque's sculptural video installations explore a fine line between form, color, and content, with filming techniques and methods of screening and presentation reinforcing the subject matter. This expanded methodology towards the medium of video seamlessly extends to the architectural spaces in which his work is presented. Roque pushes for a thoughtful exchange between architecture and artwork, and, yet, they remain singular, their respective boundaries never dissolving entirely.

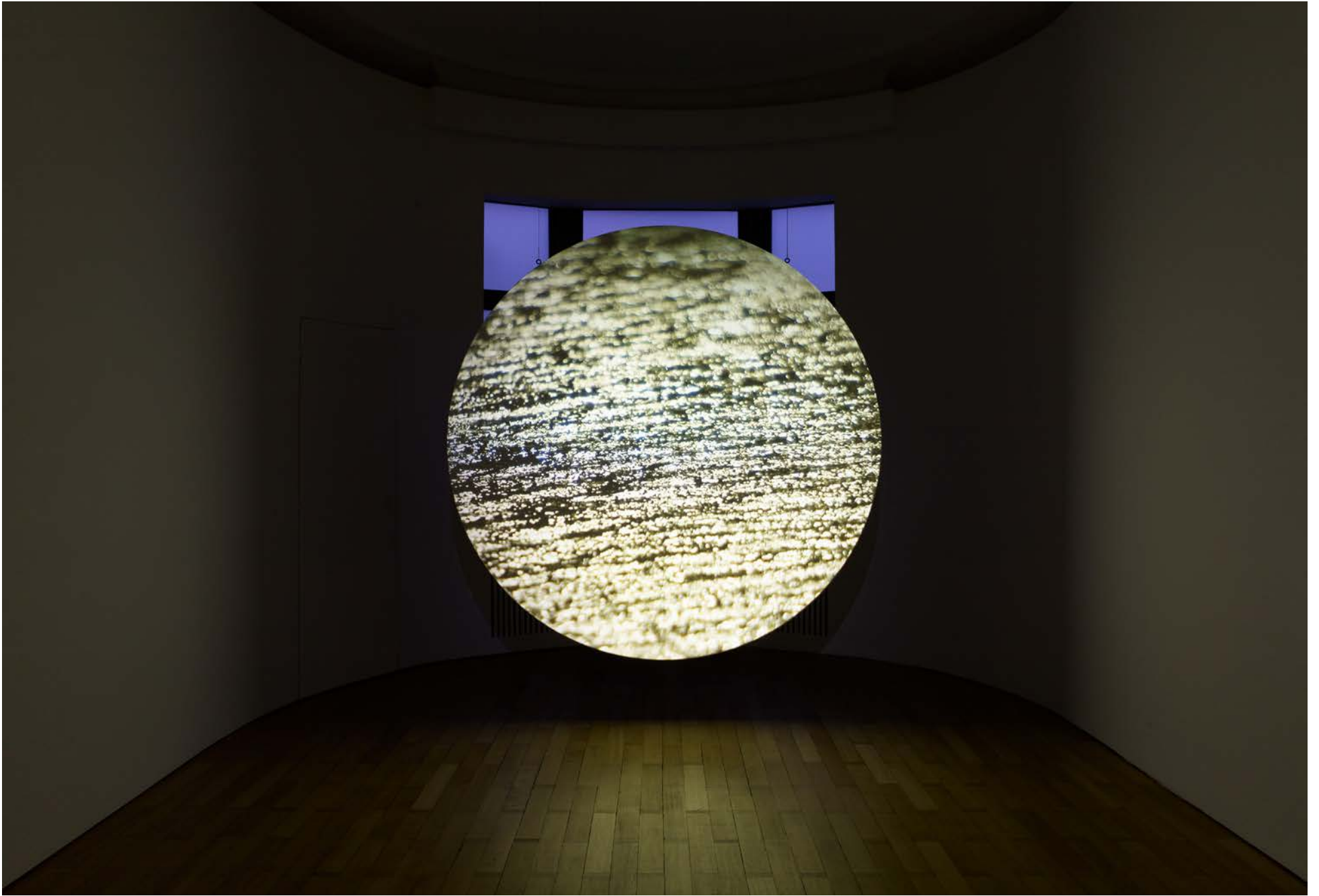

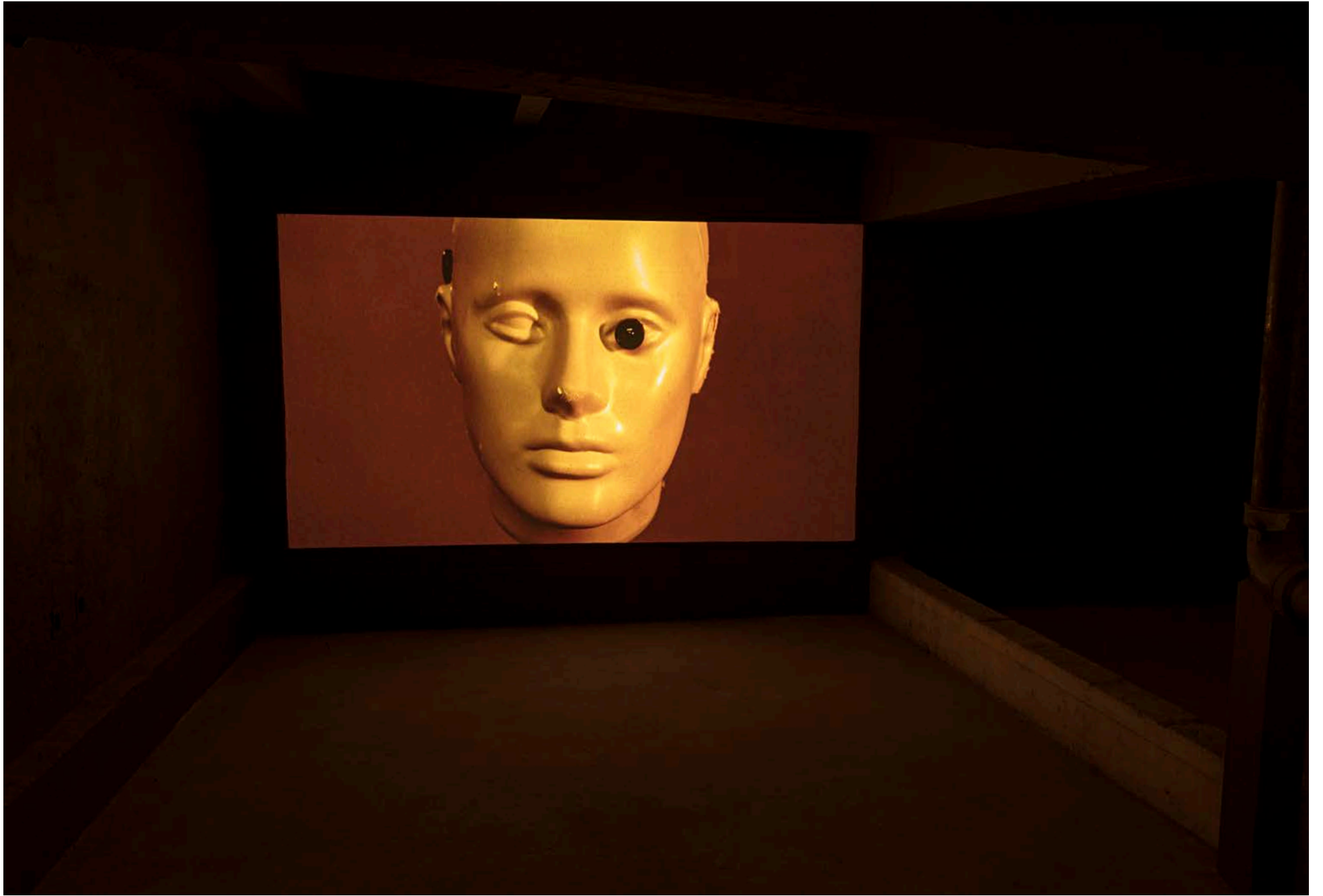

Roque is interested in science fiction as a means of reflecting on geopolitical, social and historical issues and to speculate on possible futures. Desire is an important vector of the artist's production. His works have the duration and the rhythm of trailers or video clips and can be presented both at the art gallery or the movie theatre. Particularly interested in the legacy of modernism, Roque relates it to the body in movement and transformation and to pop culture's imagery, using the cinematographic language to build narratives and visual essays in a suspended time. His characters inhabit post-apocalyptic and dystopian scenarios to where the artist brings elements from the history of art and architecture.

Noite

After two decades creating moving images, the new forms presented by Luiz Roque emerge from clay. The ceramics resemble accessories, items to be worn or attached to the body, power objects. Their zoomorphic outlines evoke past worlds or a future where plastic had been replaced by mud. The sculptures are not stood on classic pedestals but depend on the wall for support. Some have been created from the merging of separate parts, in a process analogous to collage. Roque's use of ceramics makes sense. The first icons, those figures that millennia later would become the celebrities of today, were molded in clay. It was only a long time afterwards that they would be captured via photographic processes. The artist's decision is, therefore, an archeology of media, a sort of return.

The kingdom of sexuality has become a huge market. The most popular dating app amongst the gay population lends its title to the new series. The pieces are accompanied by two works that investigate sexuality in a more explicit way. Whilst the photogram Cortina [Curtain] is a eulogy to orgasm, República [Republic], a work commissioned by Pivô in partnership with Passerelle Centre d'Art Contemporain, challenges our understanding of pleasure. Employing a documental tone and images captured on video and Super-8, the film revolves around performer Marcinha do Corinho. Marcinha was one of the pioneers of the Atlantic crossing that has taken numerous Brazilian transgender women to Europe. The work is also a homage to the city center of São Paulo and its square República, a gathering point for sex workers. Sexual and gender immigration flows are at the core of the narrative. The round exhibition window is a reference to the 'enchanted circle' that distinguishes between sexual acts according to a hierarchy of value, marking off what is good/healthy/ natural in sex and what is not.¹ Those who inhabit the outside limits of this circle are exposed to the spotlight of fashion or the searchlight of police. The subversive implications of style are made at night.

It is an anthological exhibition composed of eight works from different moments in the artist's fifteen-year career. The works are short-lived and this small size dialogues with other audiovisual formats such as those seen on television since the 1980s, in addition to a rhythm closer to music videos.

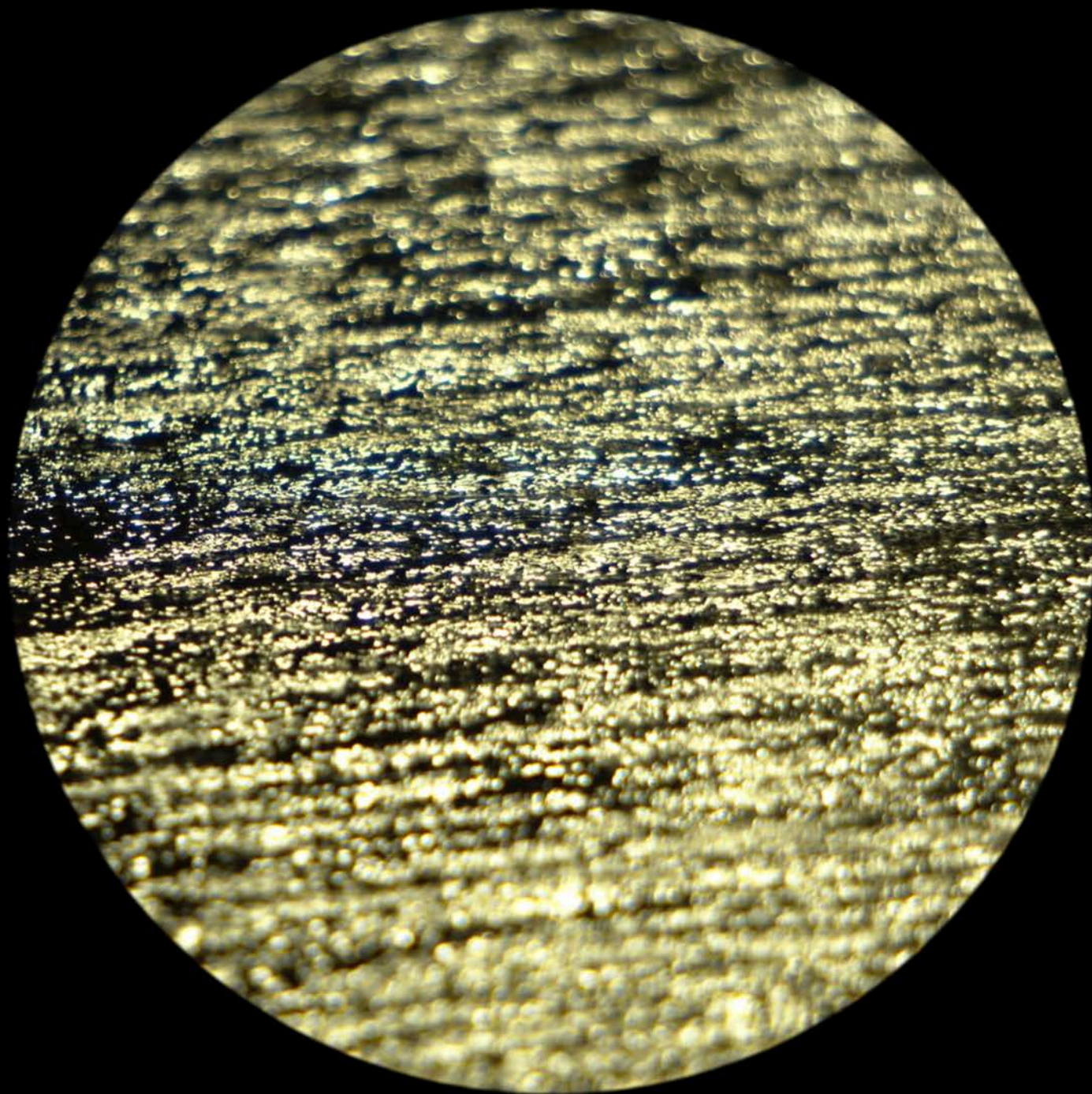

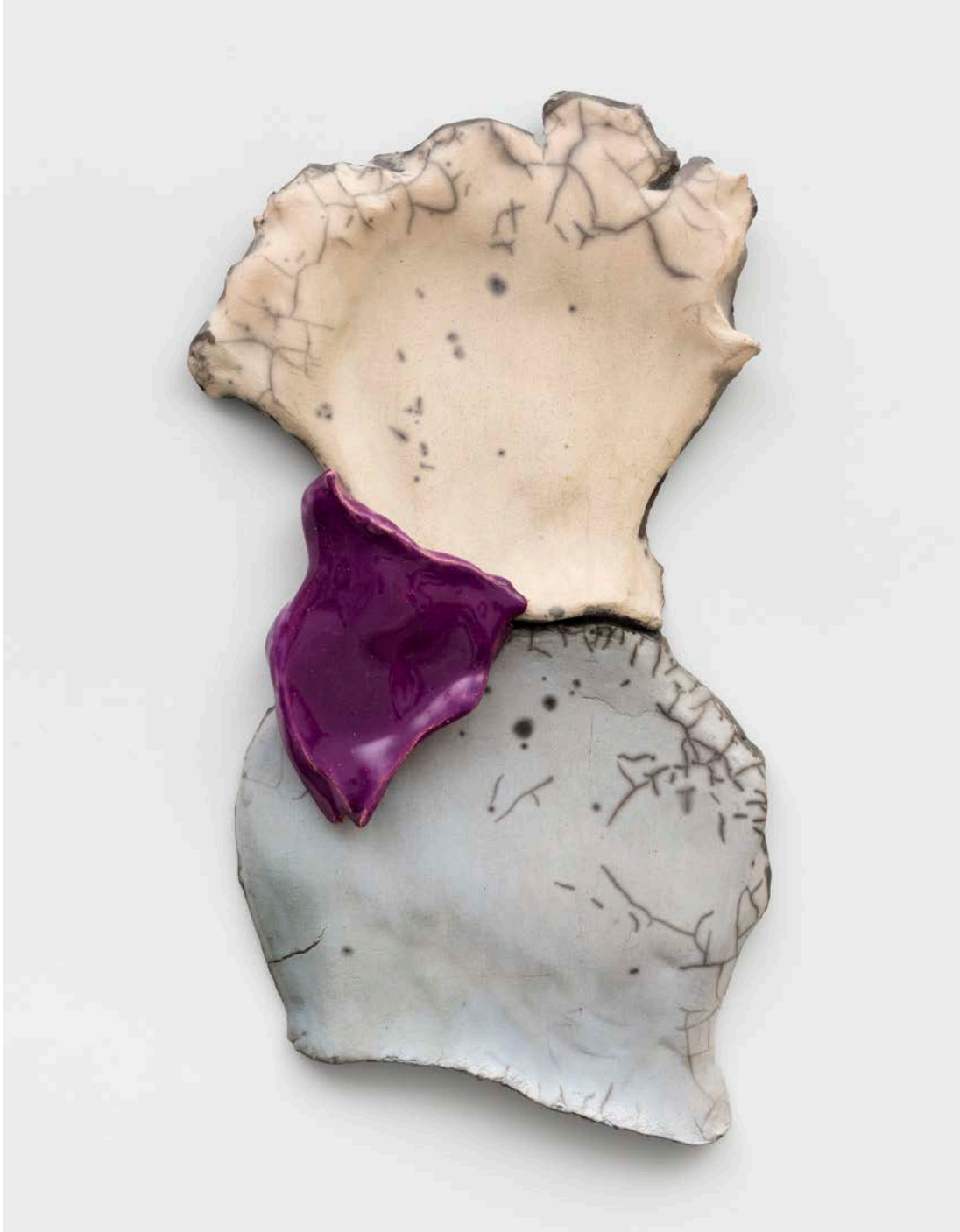

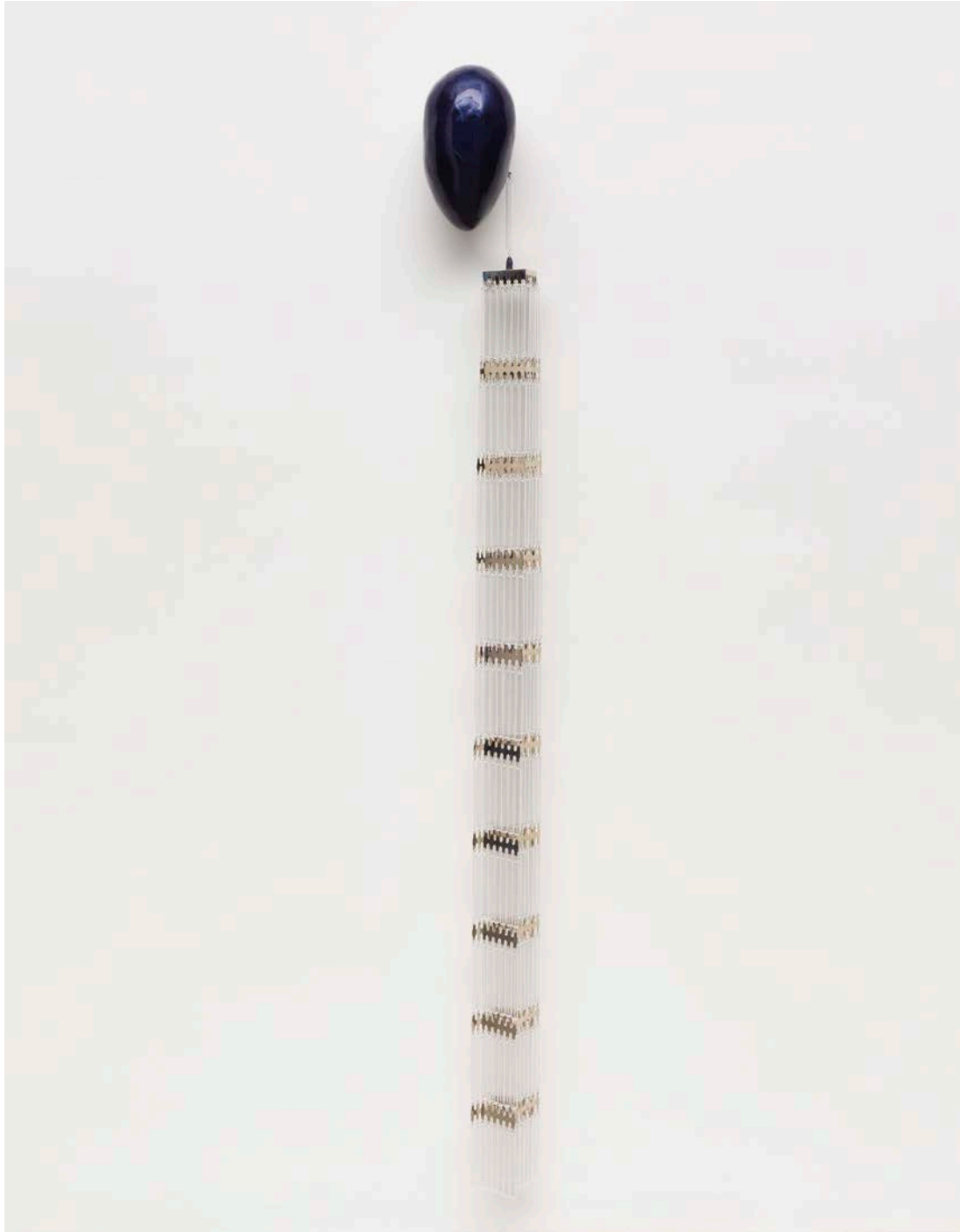

When I am interested in people in film, I am particularly fascinated by what they do in terms of performance and entertainment. Even though there's always a fiction behind the scenes, there's no casting process per se when I'm drafting an idea for a moving-image project. First, I meet the performer, and then comes the acting, which happens according to their performances in the moment. In this way, it's a kind of documentary approach with fantasy. I met most of the people portrayed in my work in the LGBTQI+ scene, either through watching shows and videos, or when they were introduced to me through friends, or friends of friends. I've also met performers with support from certain organizations, as many of my film productions were developed within residency contexts.


