Beyond the clear references to organic life or prehistoric artistic experimentations, what stands out in Solange Pessoa's work is a singular, pulsating vitality, which manifests itself in peculiar contours that create figures in which we recognize the primordial movement of genesis. Pessoa's expansive practice draws inspiration from a plethora of sources: archaeology, prehistoric cave paintings, traditional craft, Brazilian Baroque, and poetry. Her stylization of life assumes a radical depth, offering a particular language for reading and imagining the world. Thus, we see species that carry traits from mineral, botanical, and animal realms and convey universality through their most regional aspects.

Solange Pessoa (b.1961, Ferros, Brazil) lives and works in Belo Horizonte.





Pilgrim Fields

Incorporating a variety of organic materials from both Brazil and Scotland, Pilgrim Fields' conjures both wild and cultivated landscapes. A series of sculptures realized in several clusters resemble seed pods, ripe vegetables, nuts, eggs, and plant-life. Created in bronze and ceramic, the sculptures nestle on beds of raw Hebridean sheep's wool, moss, dried flowers, hops, kelp, and reeds from Scottish marshland. Pessoa's sensual and visually tactile works speak to the colonial, agricultural, ecological and material histories that have shaped the landscape as well as evoking primordial, mythical and ritualistic associations.

Solange Pessoa

At Kunsthaus Bregenz, Solange Pessoa draws attention to the regional and unifying, inextricably linking her works and the place where they are shown. As in her artistic practice to date, Pessoa makes the site, local nature, and regional cultural history itself the subject of her exhibition. For her installations, the artist gathers raw materials available in the region: soil, plants, fruit, animal bones, and feathers, which she then fills into objects and containers. Existing works will continue to grow further with the exhibition site, new works were on view for the first time at Kunsthaus Bregenz.






Earthworks features a selection of earth and fresco paintings, ceramic sculptures, and one video relating to Solange Pessoa's enduring relationship to land and spirited use of organic materials. Multifarious and experimental in its approach to material, Pessoa's oeuvre is at once transgressive and cohesive—in a league of its own determination. Though drinking from a well of cultural references—including Brazil's Tropicalia and Antropofagia movements, Indigenous craft, the Baroque, Land Art, and her own dreams—her peerless approach is rooted in her intuitive and unbridled exploration of organic matter and form.



The origins of this collective exhibition can be found in an observation by its scientific advisor, Ariel Salleh: “Bringing ecology, feminism, socialism and Indigenous politics together means giving up the Eurocentric lens for a genuinely global one.” In its determination to think the world beyond the Nature-Culture divide, the exhibition follows the trajectories of artists with a different approach to elements – earth, air, fire, water, plants and minerals, irreducible to their mere materiality. They are both medium and tool – cultural, historic and political vectors being revitalised in a context of ecological emergency.

Utilizing the entirety of the Brussels gallery space, the show includes a new body of biomorphic ceramic sculptures, a series of genipap paintings (2013-2017) as well as the new triptych Primavera Bêbada (English: Drunk Spring) (2019). The exhibition also showcases new sculptures made from cement and moss, as well as Pessoa's long-conceived installation, comprising of three large bronze reliefs and grapes. Occupying an entire room on the first floor of the gallery, this work is closer in scope and complexity to Pessoa's museum installations.







Curated by the Núcleo de Pesquisa e Crítica da Pinacoteca and under the general coordination of José Augusto Ribeiro, curator of the museum, the group show takes as its starting point the film *The Origin of the Night: Amazon Cosmos* (1973-77), by German artist Lothar Baumgarten, unpublished in Brazil, and presents it alongside a selection of works by four Brazilian artists - Antonio Dias, Carmela Gross, Solange Pessoa, and Tunga. In common, the selected works allude to primordial times and actions that would have contributed to the narratives about the origin of life.



The acute verticality of mountains and the reality of these volumes, the expanded fields and savannas, the abundant microcosms, the faraway archaeologies, claim complex materialities and spatialities, translating their perception into installations, sculptures, drawings, videos.
